" Annie Laurie " is an old Scottish song based on a poem said to have been written by William Douglas (1682?-1748) of Dumfriesshire, about his romance with Annie Laurie (1682-1764). The words were modified and the tune was added by Alicia Scott in 1834/5. The song is also known as " Maxwellton Braes ".

The story is that William Douglas (who allegedly wrote the poem) fell in love with Annie Laurie, a member of a rival clan some time between 1685 and 1705. The poem is said to have been published at the time, but (according to Fuld) no printing prior to Sharpe's of 1823 has been found.
