### Beginning to Close Read {Notice and Note} | Teaching in Room 6

NOTICE: When a character does something that contrasts with what you'd expect, or contradicts his/her earlier acts or statements. Ask: Why is the character doing that? NOTE: Write and/or discuss your questions and possible answers to them. The answers might help you make a prediction or draw an inference about the character, plot or conflict.
