Most total hip replacement patients are over 55 years of age, however the surgery is sometimes performed on younger patients. Patients who are candidates for total hip replacement surgery generally have: Severe pain that impedes work and everyday activities Pain that can not be managed by anti-inflammatory medications, canes or walkers

The study also predicted that total hip replacement surgeries will soar by 171 percent by 2030 and total knee replacement surgeries will grow by 189 percent. So-called revision surgeries, in which previous replacements are themselves replaced after they wear out, are expected to rise by 142 percent for hip replacements and 190 percent for knee replacements.

The knee has to balance off-center loads and move side to side. And with a total knee replacement, you are removing a lot of tissue and bone. Postoperative pain is higher with knees since the soft tissue affected by the surgery must stretch more than soft tissue around the hip. So knee patients have to accept some limitations?

Most patients who undergo total knee replacement are age 50 to 80, but orthopaedic surgeons evaluate patients individually. Total knee replacements have been performed successfully at all ages, from the young teenager with juvenile arthritis to the elderly patient with degenerative arthritis.

A total hip replacement is when the top part of the femur and the socket part of the pelvis is replaced. This is done by placing metal alloy on the top of the femur and in the socket part of the pelvis. A smooth piece of cup-shaped plastic is inserted between this new ball and socket, which allows the ball to move smoothly.

Total hip replacement (or hip arthroplasty) is a technique that has become widespread in recent years in response to the need for improving hip joints that have been damaged by injury or arthritis. Joint replacement surgery may offer the best treatment option for long-term improvement for the hip joint when other treatments have proven inadequate.

Conclusion: This study highlights that despite a wide range of apps currently available to total hip replacement and total knee replacement patients, there is significant variability in their quality.
